Based on the success of the last years' courses held in amongst others Copenhagen, Lisbon, Berlin and Amsterdam, the Executive Committee has arranged again for a one day introductory intermediate level course.

The selected topic is

### **Individuals moving jurisdictions for life or for work.**

Many times individuals and their families need to move between countries for work, family or safety reasons. What is the tax impact of that move on these families? This TTN tax course will focus on the tax issues that such individuals and their families must consider.

The morning session will be presented by **John Graham** who will focus on the issues relevant to such jurisdictional transitions.



**John Graham** founded Graham Smith & Partners International Tax Counsel in Amsterdam in 1988. He advises on international tax matters for both corporate and private clients. He also teaches International Tax Law and European Tax Policy at the School of International Studies at Avans University of Applied Sciences in Breda. He was Chairman of the International Tax Committee of an international accounting network for a number of years. John is qualified as an accountant in England and the Netherlands and has degrees in Commerce from the University of Birmingham and Fiscal Economics from the University of Amsterdam. He speaks regularly at courses and seminars around the world and writes on tax matters in Dutch and international journals.



The afternoon session will be presented by **Steven H. Hagen** and will focus on tax issues related to US taxpayers moving abroad and non US person moving to the United States.



**Steven H. Hagen** is a partner at Harper Meyer Perez Hagen O'Connor Albert & Dribin LLP a Miami based internationally focused law firm. Mr. Hagen practices in the international, tax and corporate practice areas, emphasizing international income tax planning focusing on the structuring of international businesses, and family office services including international estate planning, establishment of domestic and international entities, limited liability companies and business transactions including the sale and acquisition of businesses.

His practice includes the structuring of offshore companies and trusts in sophisticated international business transactions, as well as the formation of other offshore tax efficient structures for foreign clients investing in the United States as well as for United States clients investing abroad.

Mr. Hagen is a frequent lecturer on various international tax related topics, is a member of The Florida Bar and is certified by The Florida Bar in the area of Taxation.

The course is intended for younger tax practitioners.

The advantage of an in house course is that by organizing the course we are able to tailor make the course and reduce costs per participant considerably. Moreover the course will be presented in one day.
